Miriam "Mickey" Lockman – Arcanum, Ohio Age 76

Participated in the first National Senior Games in St. Louis in 1987 and won the gold medal in volleyball at the 1997 National Senior Games in Tuscon. Has won medals in badminton, track and field and volleyball at all levels of competition. Has been a great ambassador for Senior Olympics at all levels. Currently serves on the Dayton/Miami Valley Senior Olympics Board of Directors.

John Murray - Dayton, Ohio Age 90

Has participated in tennis, table tennis and track events for many years. Placed first in tennis and table tennis singles and second in the 800m run in the 2000 Ohio Senior Olympics in Dayton. Has never lost a 1500m race in his age bracket and has lost only one 400m race. Loyal supporter of the Dayton Area Senior Olympics.

Paul Reichert – Dayton, Ohio Age 81

Earned two silver medals in bowling on the national level along with top ten finishes in shot put and discus. Has won many gold medals in bowling and discus and shot put on the state level. Has faithfully participated in the local games each year since 1988. Currently serves on the Board of the Dayton/Miami Valley Senior Olympics.

Eleanor Ridinger – Yellow Springs, Ohio Age 89

Has attended every National Senior Games since 1987. Placed in the top five in discus, javelin and shot put many times, including silver medals in discus, javelin and shot put in 1997 and a gold medal in javelin in the 2001 National Games. Has qualified for national competition through placing first or second in the Ohio Senior Olympics in discus, javelin and shot put. Participates in field events, the race/walk event and swimming on a local level.

Herschel Self – Beavercreek, Ohio Age 83

Has participated in table tennis at every National Senior Games except 1995. Won silver medal in table tennis doubles (partner Egons Krumins) in 1999, gold medalist with same partner in 2001 and bronze medalist in table tennis singles in 2003 National Senior Games. Has many first and second place finishes in table tennis singles and doubles in the Ohio Senior Olympics. Participates faithfully in table tennis each year in the Dayton Area Senior Olympics.

Bernie Shouse – Dayton, Ohio Age 84

Two gold medals in bowling in the 2001 National Senior Games in Baton Rouge. Numerous gold, silver and bronze medals in bowling on the state level. Has participated each year since 2000 in the Dayton Area Senior Olympics and placed first and second in many events.

Sid Stansel – Kettering, Ohio Age 71

Has many top five finishes on a national level in table tennis. Participates on the state and local level and consistently finishes first in table tennis. Plays both singles and doubles and mixed doubles (with his wife Jan). Loyal Senior Olympics participant for many years.

David Lamar Cramer – Huber Heights, Ohio Age 55

Qualified for the 2001 and 2003 National Games. Numerous gold, silver and bronze medals in track and field events and badminton on the state level. Won six events, placed second in three events and placed third in one event at the 2002 Dayton Area Senior Olympics.

Lloyd Hathcock – Dayton, Ohio Age 58

Silver medalist in both the 100m and the 200m track event at the 1999 National Senior Games in Orlando. Bronze medalist in the 200m event and fourth place in the 100m event at the National Senior Olympics in Baton Rouge in 2001. First place in the 100m and 200m, and third place in the 50m in the Huntsmen World Senior Games in St. George, Utah in 2004. Record holder in the 100m and 200m for the Ohio Senior Olympics. Has participated and won at local level in Dayton, Cincinnati and Akron.
